#### Who is Eligible?

- Caregivers under the age of 21, new parents, single parents, relatives as caregivers, and foster parents
- Families who utilize government assistance
- Child is enrolled in early intervention or was found ineligible for early intervention
- General life stressors affecting parenting
- Caregivers with disability and/or mental health concerns

The HUG program strives to increase parents' knowledge of early childhood development by supporting their parenting practices. Through regular screening, the HUG program is able to detect developmental delays and health issues early.

The partnership between families and their Family Support Specialist can help families grow to their highest potential.



#### Our Curriculum

During each weekly or bi-weekly visit with your Family Support Specialist, you will focus on...

- Child Development We focus on language, literacy, motor, cognitive, and social development and check that everything is on track with bi-yearly developmental screenings
- Positive Parent-Child Interactions Each week we will provide an activity
   for you to do with your child to
   strengthen bonds and let you have a
   hands-on approach to your child's
   development
- Family Well-Being -As your partner, we will focus on your family's needs and values and support you along the way to reaching your goals.
- Development-Centered Parenting As your child grows and develops, their needs change. During your visits, your FSS will support your family in these areas: Attachment, discipline, health, nutrition, safety, sleep, transitions/routines
- **Group Connections** An opportunity for parents to share experiences, learn from other parents, support one another, observe their child with other children, practice parenting skills, and for children to have a fun, hands-on learning experience

Once enrolled, you will also have access to additional community resources and other services through Options and Advocacy.
